

TERMS OF REFERENCE

Programme Associate for Adolescent Sexual and Reproductive Health (ASRH)	
Purpose of consultancy:	<p>UNFPA has supported the Government of Indonesia in fulfilling the rights and needs of youth and adolescents by providing evidenced-based advocacy and supporting Government to inform youth policy through knowledge sharing. In working with the Ministry of Health (MoH) and Ministry of Education and Culture (MoEC), UNFPA has contributed to the development of comprehensive health module which includes ASRH, applying international norms and standards. UNFPA is committed to supporting the MoH and MoEC to incorporate ASRH into the national curriculum. MoH and MoEC have used the International Technical Guidance on Sexuality Education (ITGSE) as the reference to develop the Module for teachers on ASRH education, with adaptation to the local social and cultural context. The module was developed comprehensively and based on age appropriate (elementary school, junior high school and senior high school). Then, UNFPA has recognized the important role that the private sector could play in the provision of ASRH services to youth. The engagement with private sector and young people will support Government efforts to fill existing gaps in Youth and ASRH programmes by bringing in resources and innovative ideas for effective interventions. In 2014, UNFPA initiated UNALA (means ‘your ability to make decisions’) as an innovative model that engages the private sector in the delivery of health information and services for young people in Yogyakarta, Indonesia.</p> <p>Therefore, UNFPA is looking to engage with an individual consultant to provide technical assistance in coordination with government, NGOs, development partners and youth networks for better implementation of the ASRH programmes at national and subnational levels.</p>
